Smoking Cessation for Cervical Cancer Survivors in a Safety Net Healthcare System: Project SUCCESS

The purpose of this study is to compare a program called Motivation and Problem Solving (MAPS) to the standard treatment to help patients with a history of dysplasia or cervical cancer quit smoking.

You may qualify if you meet all of the following criteria:

- Are 18 years of age or older
- Have a history of dysplasia or cervical cancer
- Have smoked any cigarettes within the last 30 days
- A history of smoking at least 100 lifetime cigarettes
- Have a working telephone number and valid home address
- Speaks English, Spanish, or both languages

What will you be asked to do?

- You will be asked to complete questionnaires at baseline.
- You will be randomly assigned to one of two groups.
 - If assigned to Group 1 you will receive materials to help you stop smoking.
 - If assigned to Group 2 you will receive materials to help you stop smoking and six telephone counseling sessions.
- You will be asked to complete follow-up questionnaires at 3 months, 6 months, 12 months and 18 months.
